



SWIM BC ADVANCE

AGE: Women Aged 16 to 17 Years (As of December 31st)
Men Aged 16 to 17 Years (As of December 31st)

IDENTIFICATION: Priority 1
Swimmers who meet the age and residency requirements and who achieve three or more Swim BC Advance *time standards* between September 1, 2021, and August 31, 2022, will be selected to the Swim BC Advance Provincial Team.

Priority 2
Swimmers who meet the age and residency requirements and who achieve three or more Swim BC Pacific Wave *consideration times* between September 1, 2021, and August 31, 2022, will be ranked by their top scoring Pacific Wave swim. The top ranked swimmers will be selected up to a grand total of 10 Women and 10 Men, inclusive of the priority one swimmers above.

Additionally, any swimmer who achieve three or more Swim BC Advance *time standards* at any point through the current 2022 – 2023 season (September 1, 2022 through August 31, 2023) will be selected to the Swim BC Advance team in addition to the 10 Women and 10 Men identified above.

ATHLETE INTAKE: The Head Coach and the Swimmer will be notified that they have been identified and will be required to complete the athlete intake on the Swim BC Learning & Development Hub including: Demonstrating an understanding of the Swim BC Code of Conduct and Ethics Policy, Swim BC Travel Policy, and Swim BC Athlete Selection and Coach Appointment Policy; Completion of the Swim BC Athlete Agreement Form, Swim BC Photo and Video Consent Form, CCES True Sport Clean 101 Course, CAC Safe Sport (Valid for 5 Years); Upload of a Headshot Photo; and Completion of the Swim BC Provincial Team Intake form.
